The talks will be evaluated by the organizational committee based on the quality of the proposed talk. Preference may be given to candidates who are closer to graduation, or candidates who have submitted more than once. The 2 selected speakers will be informed by ***Thursday June 4th***.

Recall that we have 2 calls per semester, so if your talk doesn't get selected this time around, you are more than welcome to submit your talk again.
